- generate scientifically valuable biodiversity data from user's personal encounters with nature












iNaturalist City Nature Challenge, (CNC) 2023 Citizen Observations in the SA Metro Boundary

- 20,119 observations
- •2,561 species
- 883 observers






Making CNC History in 2023!

- San Antonio beats Austin for the first time in City Nature Challenge history! (San Antonio Metro Area places 3rd in Texas)
- 15 participating cities in Texas
- number of observations at 20,119. Research Grade Observations : 64.1%
- number of species at 2564; 30 species are on the threatened list
- average observations/observer went up from 17.75 in 2022 to 23.27 in 2023
- global ranking moved up to 18th place out of 482 cities worldwide








Citizen Science Data Flow

How is iNaturalist data used?

- Wildlife Land Management Tax Exemption Tracking
- Seed Progradation Location
- On Vacation its my Eco Tourist Map.
- Wildscapes Certification tracking at home
- Use iNaturalist filters to find observations for Native Plant Sale Pictures and Training
- Finding Species of Greater Conservation Need (SGCN)





Texas Stream Team (TST) Water Quality Monitoring Citizen Science Project




- 22 River Warrior TST volunteers
- 30 TST active monitoring sites
- State coordinator is impressed with local Warrior volunteer effort



What is TST?

- Certified Citizen Scientists collect water quality data at sites across the watershed
- Data is compiled in a report to analyze trends.
- Reports are reviewed & approved by Texas Commission of Environmental Quality (TCEQ)
- Data is available to TCEQ & River Authority Scientists

Apple Snail Removal Champion River Warrior: David Mullins passes the 3000 mark!

- Removed 3,504 snails and 1,639 egg cases> 94% of all volunteer snail
 - collections
 - > 41% of all volunteer egg collections
- David has taken on role of "Apple Snail Removal Ambassador"
- River Warriors contribute more than 30% of total removals

- 29,495 total litter observations on Litterati in our watershed
- 15 groups made 9,813 Litterati observations during Earth Week Corporate Challenge
 320 volunteers took part in litter clean-
- ups
 27 submissions for self-led group clean-
- 27 submissions for sen fed group clean ups through website
 82 total volunteer pledges
 10 virtual educational trainings conducted for large groups with anti-litter
- messaging
 A unique plogging (picking up litter while jogging) event conducted Sept 17, 2022
