

- OBJECTIVE 4: Support programs and projects to reduce trash, pollutants, and other debris in the river watershed





Budget Development Briefing – General Fund

- Projected Revenues Available: \$48.8M
 - Base Operating Expenditures:
 - \$33.2M
 - Personnel, Operating, Capital, Debt, Reimbursements
 - Proposed Projects:
 - **\$4.0M** (delayed: \$1,370,000)
 - Proposed Department Resources:
 - **\$2.1M** (delayed: \$90,131)
 - Transfer to Unrestricted Reserve:
 - \$280,000 Euclid Repayment
 - \$320,000 Reserve Balance
 - Unrestricted Project Reserve (new balance): \$4.39M
 - Operating Reserve Target (25%):
 - \$8.9M

- Other Collaborative Projects (8)
 - 3 with proposed new funding
- Grant Fund full funding (7)
 - 1 pending



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


Existing – New Funding Request

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Freshwater Mussel Propagation

- Groundbreaking proactive ecological restoration
- USFWS facilities actively developing production methods and producing juveniles/adults
- Reintroduction set to begin summer or fall 2021


- Proposed Budget \$500,000
